Pvt. Charlie E. Brown, who has been overseas for 26 months arrived home Saturday night to spend a 21 day furlough with his mother, Mrs. John Marcum, and his sister, Mrs. Claude Miller. Pvt. Brown received the Purple Heart for wounds suffered on Anzio Beachhead in Italy. He also took part in fighting in North Africa and Sicily.

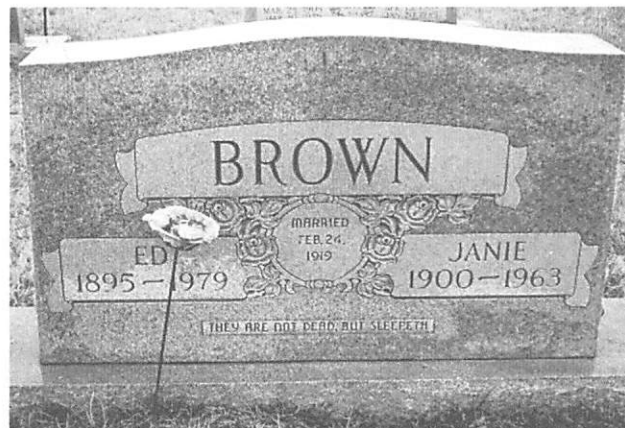

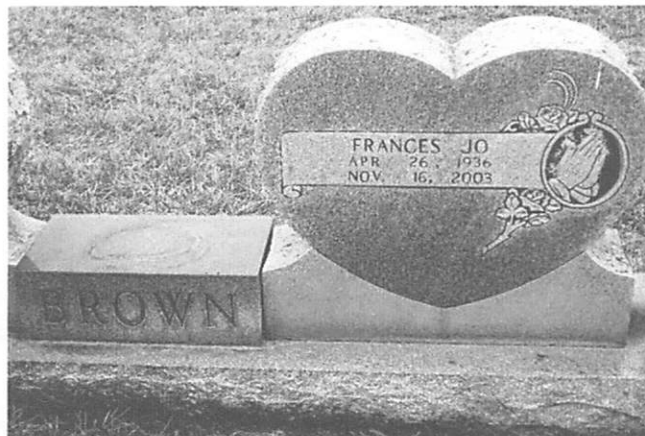

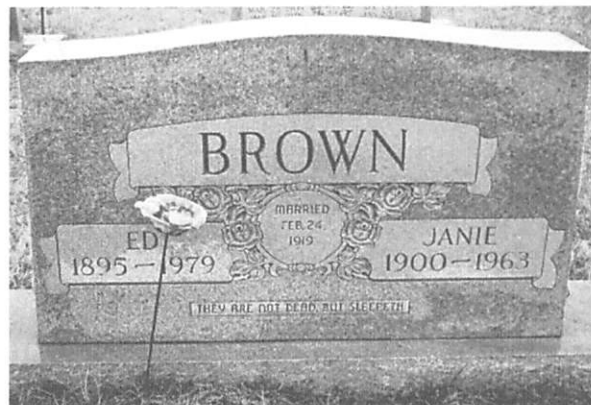

Mr. John Y. Brown, one of the most widely known men in Larue County, died at the home of his son-in-law, Mr. Richard Redman, of the Parkers Grove section, on last Friday morning, of infirmities incident to old age. The funeral services were conducted on the following day at South Fork Church, in the presence of a large congregation and the body was buried in the South Fork Cemetery beside the grave of his wife, who preceded him in death 11 years. "Uncle Jack" as every one knew him, was one of the most familiar characters in the county and was one of the few old landmarks here long before Larue County was ushered into existence. He was widely known also in Hart and Hardin counties. Every one knew "Uncle Jack" and every one liked him. Possessed of a jovial, good-natured disposition, his presence wherever he went was warmly welcomed. Mr. Brown led an active life from the cradle to the grave, and when the final summons came, although in his 88th year, he was loth to give up the battle of life. He was fortified, however, in that Christian faith which promised him a life of happiness in the world beyond, having been an active member of the South Fork Baptist Church for many years. He was a conscientious man, an upright citizen and a friend to all in time of need. He was well known for his many kind deeds and charitable acts and his services which were so willingly tendered to those in need of assistance, were often invoked and never withheld. Mr. Brown was a member of a family noted for its longevity. He was one of 9 children, 4 of whom are yet living. They are, Mrs. Elizabeth Highbaugh, of Hart County, aged 90; Mrs. Margaret Gaddie, of Salt Lake City, Utah, aged 80; Mrs. Virginia Highbaugh, Hart County, aged 70; Mr. Mart Brown, of near Sonora, aged 83. Those who have died and their respective ages at the time of death are James H. Brown, aged 88; Mrs. J. J. Crouch, aged 62; Mrs. Sarah W. Compton, aged 81; David Judson Brown, aged 59. His father, Rev. William M. Brown, lived to the age 67 years. He was one of the pioneer preachers of this and adjoining counties, where he held many a camp-meeting in the good old times when churches were few and far between and when people would drive many miles to hear the gospel preached.
