The Old Testament - Questions to Consider

Week 7: Job 41-42 ~ Exodus 1-13 **Small Group Warm Up Question:**

Which family member had the biggest spiritual impact on you? Why? How?

- 1. When God described the Behemoth in Job 40 & Leviathan in Job 41, did you read them to be mythical or real? What do you make of Job 41:19-21, could this be a dragon? Are the 11 animals of Job 39 mythical or real? Does Behemoth and Leviathan match any modern-day animals? Or do they sound like a dinosaur? Could they be dinosaurs that perished in the flood or a post-flood ice age? What is God trying to communicate to Job through these animal descriptions from Job 38-41? What can we learn from this?
- 2. What do you think about Job's reply to God in Job 42? How do you see God's mercy in Job 42? How do you see God's grace in Job 42? How would you respond to God if He confronted you with your own foolishness and ignorance? After reading the book of Job, how would you summarize it for someone else? What lesson do you want to take away from the book of Job?
- 3. What do you think it would have been like to be an Israelite living in Egypt after 400 years of slavery? What were Pharaoh's motives in killing off the Israelite baby boys? What was Pharaoh's fear? What do you think the motives are behind the modern-day killing of babies through abortion? What are the fears of the parents who choose to take the lives of their children by abortion? How can we help people facing those fears?
- 4. Contrasted to Pharaoh are the Egyptian midwives who "feared God" (Exodus 1:17) and "let the boys live." When might Christians have to stand up against their government or ruler out of a fear of God? What risk did these Egyptian midwives face? How did God bless the midwives?
- 5. Exodus 2 describes the first adoption in the Bible through Moses' adoption by Pharaoh's daughter. What sort of courage do you think it took for Moses' mother to give him up for adoption? What sort of courage do you think it took for Pharaoh's daughter to adopt Moses? Why is adoption such a beautiful picture of God's love for us? Have you ever considered adoption? What do you think some of the challenges are with adoption? Rewards?

Exodus (ESV)

1. Why Do We Try to S_____ Ourselves? Our Good Works Are Never Enough to Save Us

Acts 7:23–29 "When he was forty years old, it came into his heart to visit his brothers, the children of Israel. [24] And seeing one of them being wronged, he defended the oppressed man and avenged him by striking down the Egyptian. [25] He supposed that his brothers would understand that God was giving them salvation by his hand, but they did not understand. [26] And on the following day he appeared to them as they were quarreling and tried to reconcile them, saying, 'Men, you are brothers. Why do you wrong each other?' [27] But the man who was wronging his neighbor thrust him aside, saying, 'Who made you a ruler and a judge over us? [28] Do you want to kill me as you killed the Egyptian yesterday?' [29] At this retort Moses fled and became an exile in the land of Midian, where he became the father of two sons."

2. Why Do We Stay S_____? Cry Out for Salvation to the God Who Hears

Exodus 2:23–25 "During those many days the king of Egypt died, and the people of Israel groaned because of their slavery and cried out for help. Their cry for rescue from slavery came up to God. And God heard their groaning, and God remembered his covenant with Abraham, with Isaac, and with Jacob."

3. Why Would We Stay E____? Turn Away from Satan

Exodus 1:13–14 "So they ruthlessly made the people of Israel work as slaves [14] and made their lives bitter with hard service, in mortar and brick, and in all kinds of work in the field. In all their work they ruthlessly made them work as slaves."

4. Why Would We Doubt God's V____? Listen to the Written Word of God in the Bible

- Exodus 6:6–7 "Say therefore to the people of Israel, 'I am the LORD, and I will bring you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians, and I will deliver you from slavery to them, and I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with great acts of judgment. I will take you to be my people, and I will be your God, and you shall know that I am the LORD your God, who has brought you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians."
- Exodus 6:9 "Moses spoke thus to the people of Israel, but they did not listen to Moses, because of their broken spirit and harsh slavery."

5. Why Would We F____? Remember God's Faithfulness

• Exodus 13:3 "Then Moses said to the people, 'Remember this day in which you came out from Egypt, out of the house of slavery, for by a strong hand the LORD brought you out from this place. No leavened bread shall be eaten."

6. Why Would We L_____for Ourselves? Live for Jesus, in Awe of God's Salvation

The Passover & Unleavened Bread - The Lamb's Redemption

- Exodus 12:26–27 "And when your children say to you, 'What do you mean by this service?' [27] you shall say, 'It is the sacrifice of the LORD's Passover, for he passed over the houses of the people of Israel in Egypt, when he struck the Egyptians but spared our houses." And the people bowed their heads and worshiped."
- Exodus 13:13 "Every firstborn of man among your sons you shall redeem."
- Exodus 13:14–15 "the LORD killed all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both the firstborn of man and the firstborn of animals....all the firstborn of my sons I redeem."

7. Why Would We L____ or T____ B____? Follow Jesus Forward Into Eternity

- Exodus 13:17 "When Pharaoh let the people go, God did not lead them by way of the land of the Philistines, although that was near. For God said, 'Lest the people change their minds when they see war and return to Egypt."
- Exodus 13:21 "the LORD went before them by day in a pillar of cloud to lead them along the way, and by night in a pillar of fire to give them light, that they might travel by day and by night."
- Exodus 13: 22 "The pillar of cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night did not depart from before the people."
- Romans 8:14–15 "For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. [15] For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, 'Abba! Father!"
- Galatians 4:8–9 "Formerly, when you did not know God, you were enslaved to those that by nature are not gods. [9] But now that you have come to know God, or rather to be known by God, how can you turn back again to the weak and worthless elementary principles of the world, whose slaves you want to be once more?"
